

# Cabled Cup Cozy

This pattern came about when I couldn't find a cup cozy that was knit in the round with worsted weight yarn. I hate the feel of the cardboard sleeves they use on "to go" cups so I wanted to replace them with something reusable.

This pattern is perfect for using up leftover worsted weight yarn. I knit mine using some leftover Cascade 220. Make some to throw in your purse, bag, car, etc. They work so much better than the cardboard sleeves and you can customize them for your style, pick your favorite colors. These would make great gifts too.

## Materials:

- Needles: US 8/5.0 mm or what ever size you need to get gauge. This pattern is designed to work with Magic Loop or 2 Circs. It can also be used with double point needles but you will need to adjust the needles to accommodate the cable on each side.
- Yarn: leftover worsted weight yarn. I used approximate 10 grams for the short cozy and 12 grams for the tall cozy
- Tapestry needle

## Abbreviations:

N = Needle

P = Purl

K = Knit

CB8F = Slip 4 stitches to your cable needle and hold to front, knit next 4sts from left hand needle then knit 4 stitches from cable needle

## Gauge:

5 sts per inch in Stockinette stitch in the round

**Instructions:**

Cast On: 36 stitches, 18sts on N1 and 18sts on N2. Join in the round being careful not to twist stitches.

Rows 1-5: \*P2, k8, p2, k2, p2, k2\*, repeat to end of round

Row 6: \*P2, CB8F, p2, k2, p2, k2\*, repeat to end of round

Repeat until your cozy is 3-4" tall. End work after working row 5. Approximately 17 rows will give you a 3" cozy and 23 rows will give you a 4" cozy. This will vary depending on your row gauge. This cozy works with most coffee shops "to go" paper cups.
